EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION PROVIDES VARIED FUNDING

Members and non-members may apply for grants

Awarding more than \$2.5 million since 1964, the Educational Foundation Board of Trustees continues its efforts to improve, enrich and encourage intercultural understanding and excellence in education.

More than \$46,700 paid to renew 23 projects ranging from an after-school science program, a museum inventory, help for children facing adversity and libraries to sending instructors to needy areas.

More than \$74,000 funded 34 new projects supporting learners in Afghanistan, Kenya, Ethiopia, Mexico and other countries. Help includes purchasing educational materials like books and playground equipment and providing support for novice educators.

Project Application Packets available from July 1 to January 3 at www.dkg.org for renewal. A new project must be received as an e-mail attachment at Society Headquarters by January 3.

Projects must meet one or more of the following:

- 🌀 Support and encourage intercultural understanding.
- 🌀 Encourage standards of excellence in education.
- 🌀 Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support, encouragement, and improvement of education.

Cornetet funds professionalism

- 🌀 Lucile Cornetet Individual Awards help educators participate in professional development.
- 🌀 Grants are awarded to employed educators, both DKG members and non-members.
- 🌀 Grants are available three times a year for all educators, especially early-career and second-career educators.
- 🌀 In February 2011, \$25,064 in grants went to 26 recipients.

Foundation supports professional development seminars

- 🌀 \$10,000 went to Germany, Texas, Michigan, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio and Kentucky.
- 🌀 Application must be received as an e-mail attachment at Society Headquarters by November 1.
- 🌀 Areas, state organizations and regions may apply, not individual chapters.
